

Subject: **LETTER OF REFERENCE**

This Letter of Reference is being submitted based on the input of multiple Correctional Officers assigned to Facility G regarding Inmate Bryan Tatum's (CDCR# C88277) work ethics and performance while assigned as an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) worker on Facility G at the California Men's Colony (CMC) State Prison. ADA workers assist inmates with various impairments, which include, but are not limited to, mobility, hearing, visual, and learning disabilities. ADA workers assist inmates to/within the dining hall, assist them to various types of appointments and ensure they arrive on time, assist with ensuring their living quarters are kept clean, compassionately speak to individuals about personal hygiene, assist with filling out/writing various forms/paperwork, and provide other assistance. An ADA worker will also provide input to staff should the ADA worker feel an inmate may require a higher level of care.

Inmate Tatum has expressed to me his desire to continue working in a similar field upon his release from prison. Therefore, I requested the input from officers who work closely with him. Inmate Tatum was assigned to an ADA position in November of 2017. In the following year and seven months, the officers observed Tatum to be nothing but professional when dealing with the inmates in his care. Inmate Tatum's demeanor has been noted to be respectful, polite, courteous, quiet, and easy to deal with. Officers stated Tatum was the 'go to guy' when staff needed assistance in dealing with an inmate requiring immediate assistance. One officer stated it will not be easy replacing Tatum upon his parole. Reviewing Tatum's Job Evaluation Reports for his ADA position reflects only Exceptional and Above Satisfactory marks, with the majority of his marks being Exceptional.

My personal interactions with Tatum have always been positive. He's respectful, truthful, and helpful. He was concerned about the void being created upon his release. He supplied me with the names of several inmates who he felt would diligently fulfill the requirements of being an ADA worker. And I agree with staff, Tatum was the 'go to guy' when I needed an ADA worker to complete a task.
